Add a CAP logo to your website

You play a key role in pointing people to our charity.

If you could spend ten minutes making a quick update to your church website, you will help even more people find and access CAP's services.

What we'd like you to do

You probably already have CAP's logo somewhere on your church website, maybe as part of a web page about your CAP work or just a stand alone logo.

We're not asking you to change anything about the way your website looks, we just want to show you how to replace that existing CAP logo with a clickable CAP logo (so if someone clicks on the logo, they'll be taken straight to the CAP homepage).

It should only take about ten minutes to make this update but it could make a huge difference to the number of people finding our site. (Note: you will need editor/admin access to your website to make these updates).

Six simple steps

- 1. Click on this link: https://capuk.org/cap-badge
- 2. Once you're on the page, you'll see the CAP logo and a box full of writing underneath it. This is the code you're going to need (see diagram below)

Copy and paste the following code onto your website:

- 3. Copy all of the code within the textbox.
- 4. Log into your church website as an editor/admin and find the page where you currently talk about CAP.
- 5. Locate the section of code related to your CAP logo:
 - It will begin with this bit of text:

Probably including some/all of these bits:

cap-logo.jpg
width=
height=

• And end with this:

For example:

If this is the first time you're adding a badge to your site, then there won't be an image to replace. Instead, just add the code you copied to the appropriate place within your blog or website code.

6. Highlight that whole section of code (from < until >) and replace it with the new code you copied from the text box.

(If you're nervous about something breaking just make a copy of the code already on your website and paste it into another document. You can always revert back to this if something doesn't look right with the new code.)

Once you have saved your work, your page should look exactly the same as it did before to everyone else, but it should now also take people through to the CAP homepage if they click on it.|
