Debt Statistics

- 11 people go debt-free every working day
- nearly four in ten (37%) were afraid to leave the home
- Six in ten (60%) were afraid to answer the door
- Nearly three quarters (73%) were too scared to answer the phone
- People below the poverty line have on average 11 different unpaid debts and have an average whole household income of just £15,109 per year.
- More than six in ten of CAP's clients are living below the poverty line.
- Nearly a quarter (24%) of CAP's clients are caring for a loved one
- Exactly half (50%) live in a household where at least one person has mental ill-health
- Nearly a quarter (24%) are struggling with bereavement.
- Two thirds (65%) of all new clients seeking help from CAP have taken out credit to cover a basic household bill
- Three quarters (75%) of new clients seeking help from CAP have consumer credit loans or overdraft debt
- Over fifty percent (51%) of CAP Clients have debt on credit cards.
- Low income was cited by one in four (23%) CAP Clients as the primary reason for getting into debt.
- • Almost half of all debt clients have a debt with the DWP, HMRC or their local authority.
- Debt clients were 41% more likely to have considered suicide than those with only private sector debts.
- 42% of clients said they were 'a lot more' stressed about local authority debts than others.
- Local authority debts had caused 69% of clients to skip meals, 77% had been made ill, 93% had suffered sleepless nights
- Further levels of stress were experienced by those with several debts deducted at source from their benefits, leaving them with little to live on.
- In the second half of 2018, CAP saw a 32% rise in new clients saying that Universal Credit was the primary reason for their debt problems.
- Over 2,500 families become debt free every year
- £3m of debt is repaid or written off every month
- 93% of our clients stay debt free, and 82% continue to use a budget to stay in control of their money

Job Club Statistics

- Unemployment rarely seems to be experienced in isolation. Three in five (57%) also have poor mental health and a quarter are caring for a loved one. According to the report, unemployed people are also more likely to have a physical disability or serious illness.
- 22% of our Job Club members have missed meals
- 51% weren't sleeping due to their circumstances
- 23% have experienced mental health issues
- 22% have contemplated or attempted suicide
- 38% of all our Job Club members find work
- Most Job Club members are considered long-term unemployed, out of work for more than 2 years
